Uber and Lyft Drivers Will Strike Outside New York's LaGuardia Airport

Travel Market Report - Feb. 22, 2023

Travelers flying in or out of New York's LaGuardia Airport this Sunday should be prepared to make alternative plans when it comes to ground transportation.

The New York Taxis Workers Alliance (NYTWA), which includes yellow cab, green car, black car, livery and app-dispatched drivers, announced plans for the strike this week. According to the NYTWA, the strike is due to low wages and other working conditions associated with Uber and Lyft.

The NYTWA is specifically protesting a recent restraining order issued by a judge after Uber sued the Taxis and Limousine Commission to block a 7.8% per minute drive pay increase.

ANA Will Operate Air Taxis To The 2025 Osaka World Expo Simple Flying - Feb. 21, 2023

All Nippon Airways will work together with leading eVTOL (electric vertical takeoff and landing) company Joby Aviation to establish flight connections between the Expo 2025 venue on Yumeshima Island and at least one location in Osaka.

Koji Shibata, CEO of ANA Holdings, said,

"The Expo 2025, Osaka, Kansai, Japan provides ANA with a global stage to demonstrate what our partnership together with Joby can deliver. As Japan's largest airline with 70 years of experience delivering safe and reliable flights to customers, being selected for this prestigious opportunity underscores our dedication to bringing together innovation and operational experience to showcase this revolutionary new service."

Around 28 million people are expected to visit the Expo between April and October 2025. The demonstration flights will be part of the Expo's Smart Mobility section, which will have its own vertiport - other eVTOL operators during the Expo will include Japan Airways, Marubeni and SkyDrive.

Zoox, Amazon's self-driving unit, has hit the road with its driverless robotaxi for the first time.

Founded in 2014, Zoox has been working to develop a fully autonomous vehicle that caters to the ride-hailing population. Just like a customer could call an Uber, Lyft or taxi for a ride to the airport, Zoox envisions a future where customers use its app to order a ride in a vehicle that drives itself.

The robotaxi doesn't have a steering wheel, pedals or driver's seat. Instead, it relies on a network of sensors to move through a city.

Some of the autonomous technology Zoox uses has already been on public roads; the company has been testing the software and hardware in Toyota Highlanders that roam around city streets, including in Seattle. But the autonomous robotaxi hadn't hit the public road until this month.

FlixBus, Greyhound owner reports record revenue, forecasts 20% growth in 2023 Reuters - Feb. 15, 2023

BERLIN, Feb 15 (Reuters) - Greyhound-owner Flix, which operates bus and train services in over 40 countries, on Wednesday reported its most successful year yet in 2022 with revenue of 1.5 billion euros (\$1.61 billion) and forecasted revenue growth of over 20% in 2023.

The company, which owns European intercity bus service FlixBus and also bought U.S. household name Greyhound in late 2021, is planning further expansion of its networks in Europe, North America and Turkey, and is adding Chile to its network in South America, it said.

It has already expanded its network in Europe to include Portugal, the United Kingdom and Baltic states.

Revenue grew over 185% in 2022 in comparison with the previous year, its statement said.

Sea-Tac taxi drivers celebrate as commissioners approve 5-year program

Taxi drivers will continue to make a living at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport — at least for five more years.

On Tuesday, Port of Seattle commissioners unanimously <u>passed an order</u> that will establish a 5-year program for taxi services. The vote follows a pilot program that began in 2019 and allowed the airport to contract taxi drivers directly instead of hiring them through a third party.

"We are standing on our final battleground for survival," said driver Samson Hailegiorgis during public comment on Tuesday. "If we lose this fight, today will be the end of my 18-year career. But with you, the commissioners, we will be able to survive the next five years without anxiety."

SEATTLE — Bystanders and first responders were honored by the <u>Port of Seattle</u> Friday for saving a man's life while traveling on a shuttle at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport last month.

On Jan. 2, the man, Mark Schroeder, collapsed on the shuttle while suffering a cardiac arrest. A woman sitting next to Schroeder noticed he was slumped over and began alerting people around her

"I grabbed his wrist and he felt really clammy and cold. So, I tried to feel his pulse on his wrist. I wasn't getting anything, he kind of slumped over. We as a group decided it was a good idea to bring him off the bus," said Samuel Cason, a Naval aircrewman.

A retired EMT began chest compressions, according to Cason, who also gave Schroeder chest compressions until first responders came.

<u>Local man pleads guilty for stealing cars from Pittsburgh International Airport rental lot</u> Yahoo! News - Feb. 22, 2023

A man from Coraopolis pleaded guilty for stealing two dozen cars from a rental parking lot at Pittsburgh International Airport in 2021.

According to the Department of Justice, Bernard Washington, 31, admitted that he worked as a contractor for the Hertz Rent a Car at the airport between May and July. During that time and into October when he stopped working there, he and co-conspirators got into the Hertz parking lot and stole around 24 vehicles in exchange for money.

At least three of the stolen cars were taken across state lines, including to Maryland, Virginia and Delaware. Washington also received at least two stolen cars from a co-conspirator, one of which crossed state lines after being stolen, officials said.

Echeverria, 32, brings in up to \$14,000 per month renting his six vehicles out to strangers in Boston on the rental platform Turo, according to documents reviewed by CNBC Make It.

The side hustle started with one car, a great location and some clever strategy. Echeverria lives mere miles from Boston Logan International Airport, and capitalizes by undercutting the prices of nearby car rental companies.

Uber unveils a new redesigned app that's personalized to you

They formed a caravan, honking as they drove down I-91 and made a lap around the state capitol. The drivers then moved on the Legislative Office Building where they went inside to speak to state lawmakers with the Transportation and Labor & Public Employees Committees.

San Antonio to Expand Its Airport by 2028

Meetings Net - Feb. 17, 2023

Right before Kansas City opens a new airport on February 28, the city council of San Antonio unveiled renderings of its own airport-upgrade project.

A new, 832,000-square-foot terminal for San Antonio International Airport is in the works for a mid-2028 opening. It will be larger than the airport's other two terminals combined and provide 16 more gates, bringing the total number of gates at the airport to 40. Further, it will accommodate larger planes that can travel longer distances, something long desired by the local business community, according to this article by Texas Public Radio.

The new space will include club lounges, an outdoor courtyard, concessions, and an upgraded corridor for international arrivals to go through customs and border inspection. The plan also calls for a new ground-transportation hub for bus transportation services such as Lyft and Uber.

"We were the busiest airport in the country," she said. "U.S. airports are the busiest in the world, so we believe we were the busiest airport for outbound traffic in the world on Monday."

"As the busiest airport in the world, Hartsfield-Jackson connects our residents to the world, and brings a world of opportunities to our doorstep," he said in a prepared statement.

Got questions about parking at KCI Airport's new terminal? The Star has answers Kansas City Star - Feb. 16, 2023

Air travelers will begin to depart and arrive from the new terminal at Kansas City International Airport in just a couple weeks.

That has some wondering what the parking situation will be like for travelers starting with the Feb. 28 opening day.

The "drive to your gate" convenience of the outmoded horseshoe-shaped terminals will be gone, but a large parking garage is not that far away — just across the departures road from the new terminal.

At seven-stories high, the parking garage has 6,219 spaces, including 85 handicapped accessible spots and 52 electric vehicle charging stations.

Valet parking will be offered by entering Level Three of the garage from the departures road.

International Airport Parking Prices

If you really want to try tracking inflation, cost out the price of airport parking.

And the cost to leave your car at the airport when you fly has skyrocketed.

Want to park your car in Doha, Qatar? Fasten your seat belt. It's nearly \$280 a week, followed by London — \$263 a week and Barcelona at \$212.

There's an argument for mass transit right there. Are there any airports with affordable parking?

There are none in the U.S., but if you happen to be driving overseas, there are still a few bargains.

Try the international airport in Manila at \$40 a week, Rome at \$32 a week, and then Bangkok at just \$28 a week.

Former Denver airport director sues city for alleged pay discrimination, retaliation

A federal lawsuit filed Monday against the City and County of Denver alleges Denver International Airport leaders retaliated against a director there after he raised concerns that he and other people of color working for the airport's parking and transportation department were paid less than their white peers.

The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in Denver, says city officials — including Mayor Michael Hancock, airport CEO Phillip Washington and Winfred Hensley, the former senior vice president of parking — failed to address the complaints made by the plaintiff, Benjamin Juarez, the airport's former director of parking.
