

### Uber awarded taxi service contract for Václav Havel Airport

Ride-hailing service Uber has been appointed the new operator of the taxi service at Václav Havel Airport Prague in the Czech Republic from the spring of 2023.

Following a competitive bidding process, Uber will guarantee a fixed fare price, quoted in advance, with 24/7 service availability, and a fleet of up to five-year-old mainly upper middle-class cars.

Jakub Puchalský, member of the Prague Airport board of directors, said, "Taxi service is key for us. #### **New Plano Transit Line Expected To Boost Airport Access**

### City of Edmonton seeks partners for direct bus route from airport to downtown

The City of Edmonton is on the hunt for help to run a direct bus service between the Edmonton International Airport and downtown.

Edmonton Transit Service estimated it would cost the city \$2.6 million a year to run a direct bus route starting in 2024, as shown in its proposed operating budget presented to council last fall.

City council decided at the end of the four-year budget deliberations in December to not to fund the new service.

Coun. Anne Stevenson said with a nearly 5 per cent property tax increase attached to the 2023 operating budget already, it was unlikely council would agree to pay for the new route.

## <u>Undercover investigators entrap people of color through illegal cabs crackdown at NYC</u> airports: lawsuit

Four New Yorkers claimed in a lawsuit on Thursday that undercover Taxi and Limousine Commission officers entrap people of color as part of a crackdown on illegal cab drivers at JFK and LaGuardia airports.

In the lawsuit filed in Brooklyn federal court, the four men allege that undercover agents from the city's Taxi and Limousine Commission posing as desperate visitors stranded at the airports "begged and groveled" for rides.

Picking up passengers for a fare without a TLC license is a violation of the city's street hail law, which was created to protect the interests of legal cabs and deter human trafficking. Street hail violations have a minimum penalty of \$1,500 for a first violation.

"The TLC's sting operations primarily target people of color, immigrants or people with limited English proficiency, many of whom, like the plaintiffs, have just dropped off their family members or friends at the airport," reads the <u>suit</u>, which seeks class-action status.

#### Saskatoon airport cab fee to be added to metered fare

A ride to the Saskatoon airport could cost residents a little extra.

The standing policy committee on transportation will have a report brought forward on Tuesday asking for the airport's commercial curb fee that is charged to taxi services to be included in taxi fare to help address high operating costs.

The fee came after a dedicated commercial curb was made for taxis at the airport in 2019 to help with the transportation of passengers.

The money helps in the development, maintenance and enforcement of the curb.

A bylaw prevents that fee, which is currently \$2 per trip, from being added to metered taxi fare, but not the flat rate fare.

### Stellantis to manufacture electric air taxis for Archer Aviation

#### Luton airport shuttle used by King to open by Easter

**BBC News** - Jan. 6, 2023

An airport shuttle that King Charles has already ridden on is due to open to the public by Easter. The Luton Direct Air-Rail Transit (DART) system, linking the airport with Luton Airport Parkway railway station, was approved in 2017 and was due to open by the end of 2020.

Luton Rising, which owns the airport, said no precise date could be given but hoped it would be operational in April.

Its costs have also risen from £200m to about £290m, it confirmed. A spokesman for Luton Rising said it was "expected to be operational by Easter" and costs "may exceed £290m". Easter Sunday is on 9 April.

Earlier costs were given at £200m and in December they had risen to £281m. The final sum was "subject to on-going confidential commercial discussions", he added.

The King was given a special trip on the DART during his visit to the town on 6 December. The DART will be a cable-drawn, driverless railway running on a 1.4-mile (2.2km) line connecting the railway station to the airport terminal in just over three minutes, 24 hours a day. It will replace shuttle buses which pick up passengers every 10 minutes.

## AVL vs. Turo: Airport says in suit that car-share company not permitted to operate in NC WLOS.com - Jan. 9, 2023

FLETCHER, N.C. (WLOS) — Asheville Regional Airport has filed a lawsuit against a ride-share business, saying it is not permitted to do business anywhere in North Carolina.

The lawsuit against peer-to-peer carsharing company Turo.

The San Francisco-based company allows private car owners to rent out their vehicles via an online and mobile interface.

But the lawsuit argues the car-sharing company is not permitted to do business at the airport or anywhere else in the state. It also suggests the parking at the airport is not intended for use by the peer-to-peer service.

The airport is building two parking structures as part of its expansion project.

Turo provided the following statement about the lawsuit on Tuesday, Jan. 10, 2022:

We are aware of the lawsuit and, as this is ongoing litigation, Turo cannot comment further at this time than the following: Turo has more than 50 airport permits across the country, including several successful agreements in North Carolina, so that local residents can share their cars with guests and with North Carolinians arriving into the state. We are actively working with the Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority on a permit that would be beneficial for the airport, our peer-to-peer carsharing community, and consumers alike. We are mindful of the fact that peer-to-peer car sharing access at airports means more marketplace options for travelers and assurance that tourism dollars are going back into residents' pockets.

### Will 'flying cars' cause traffic jams in the sky?

ON A GOOD DAY, assuming decent weather, little traffic, and skills behind the wheel, a cab ride from John F. Kennedy International Airport in Queens to downtown Manhattan should take about 45 minutes. Yet who can reliably predict New York City traffic? That trip could last twice as long on a bad day.

Now assume you could avoid the streets entirely and get to lower Manhattan in minutes. By some estimates, more than 200 startups are racing to deploy what popular culture has dubbed flying cars. And, by their admittedly optimistic estimates, there's a chance that the 45-minute drive on pavement from JFK will be converted to a 10-minute flight through the air by the end of this decade.

Leaders in the quest to make cabs airborne believe everyday passengers at places like airports will exchange treks on four wheels for sorties through the skies. "Being able to fly over traffic and reach your destination in a much more predictable time will be very appealing," says John Criezis, head of mobility operations for Overair, a California-based maker of flying taxis. Market studies commissioned by NASA predict that by 2030, as many as 750 million flights will ferry passengers to and from destinations near or within US cities each year.

### Drone company hopes to introduce "air taxis" for Paris 2024 Olympics

Drone manufacturer Volocopter says it wants to make its "air taxis" accessible in the city of Paris in time for the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games. Its product, called Velocity, is still in development but the company hopes it can be on the market in time for the Olympics beginning on July 26 2024.

Velocity is an unmanned aerial vehicle which is controlled from the ground, and can travel as far as 20 kilometres on a trip. According to the company, it is four times less noisy than a helicopter.

European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) executive director Patrick Ky ensured that it would not be rolled out if it had not met standards. "My job is to make sure that the only vehicles which can fly are safe," said Ky to *Euronews*. "So if you see something flying, then it's safe because we would have certified it, in particular for the Summer Olympic Games of 2024.

"We will certify the machine, which will provide taxi services between Charles de Gaulle [airport] and the centre of Paris; and if it is certified, it means that it's safe. And so when we say we certified, it means that we check it's at the same level as a commercial aircraft, actually. So, yes, if it flies in 2024, it is because it's safe. Otherwise, it will not fly."

Paris 2024 has already committed to becoming the first "climate-positive" Games, meaning carbon emissions would be less than what it contributes environmentally in return.

### **Transport Dept's public notice on blue taxis**

The Transport Department will assess the total number of taxis at the new airport's pre-paid counter after receiving applications till the deadline on January 23.

The Department, on Thursday, published a public notice inviting applications from Pernem locals, who are interested in joining the prepaid blue airport taxi with a notified stand.

The Department has already proposed an amendment for blue colour airport taxis with identical terms and conditions to yellow-black taxis. As per the notice, the applications in prescribed pro forma along with supporting documents are to be submitted in the office of the Assistant Director of Transport at Pernem from January 10- 23.

"We will assess the total number of taxis at the new airport only after we compile the data. The application format will be made available on January 9," Director Rajan Satardekar told The Goan.

The Department has emphasized that unemployed youth and Mopa airport-project-affected persons will be given first preference.

"After preliminary Assessment of demand, necessary steps as mandated under The Goa Motor Vehicle Rules will be initiated in order to complete the process and allot the slots as approved by the State Government," the notice stated.

The taxi operators, opposing the app-based cab services at Mopa, were assured of a special prepaid taxi counter for Pernem locals. The counter will operate alongside the app-based cabs – Goa Taxi App and Goa Miles. The new app has already found over a thousand interested taxi operators.

## San Jose, Oakland Airports Battle To Regain Pre-COVID Passenger Levels Aviation Pros - Jan. 6, 2023

SAN JOSE — Passenger activity at the airports in San Jose and Oakland is cruising at altitudes well below the heights where they soared before the outbreak of the coronavirus.

The deadly bug unleashed an array of economic ailments on the travel markets and the hotel sector in the Bay Area and worldwide.

Updated reports suggest that both San Jose International Airport and Oakland International Airport continue to struggle to reclaim their pre-coronavirus glory days.

During November, San Jose airport handled 1.03 million passengers while Oakland airport accommodated slightly fewer than 972,500 passengers, according to separate reports released by the aviation hubs.

Passenger activity during November was up 24.4% at San Jose airport compared with the same month in 2021, according to statistics that the South Bay airport posted.

Oakland airport's passenger activity in November was up 24.4% from the same month in 2021, the East Bay airport reported.

## RDU Airport Wants To Build Thousands of Parking Spaces, Seeks Public Feedback First Aviation Pros - Jan. 6, 2023

Raleigh-Durham International Airport wants to more than triple the size of its largest surface parking lot, expanding its remote parking capacity on forested land near Interstate 40.

RDU plans to add about 8,700 spaces to <u>Park Economy 3</u>, the lot off National Guard Drive near the Sheetz gas station on Aviation Parkway. The lot now has 3,820 spaces, served by shuttle buses that carry passengers to and from the terminals.

Airport officials will present their plans at a public workshop Monday evening, the start of a process to study the project's potential impact on the environment. Some people have already raised concerns about the expansion because of the lot's proximity to William B. Umstead State Park.

## <u>SeaTac Airport ranked as top performing airports, amidst continued improvement spending</u>

### eVTOL Evolution: The Past, Present & Future of Air Mobility

From July to November of 1919, one of the most significant, yet lesser-known pioneers of aviation, US Army Air Corps Lt. Ernest Emery Harmon, successfully piloted the very first flight around the rim of the continental United States. The nation closely observed this trailblazing 'Round-the-Rim' flight, stirring front-page headlines across the country. The flight began at Bolling Field, Washington DC, and flew counterclockwise westward across the northern states, along the Pacific Coast, eastward along the Mexican border, and then across the South, returning to Bolling for a total distance of approximately 10,000 miles that were flown in 114 hours and 45 minutes. This nearly 4-month long journey was a momentous achievement during the infancy of winged flight.

A few months before the 'Round-the-Rim' flight, Harmon wrote a detailed article on March 30, 1919, *New York Sun* about the first trans-Atlantic flight in a 'heavier than air machine.' In it, he expressed his vision of the future of aviation and, in his own words, predicted, "I believe that the time is not far off when you will find aerial garages in every big city, where you can buy a plane and be taught to fly it, where you can store one overnight and where you can hire an aerial taxi to take you from one town to another, or an aerial bus to show you the city."

## Park your cash when you park your car at Norfolk International Airport WAVY.com - Jan. 9, 2023

Staffed self-service and credit card-only lanes are open 24 hours per day to serve people leaving the garages and parking lots. Self-pay kiosks are open 24 hours per day to serve people leaving the Daily East surface lot.

## New 2,400-space parking garage in works for Jacksonville International Airport Jacksonville.com - Jan. 1, 2023

The holiday season was a fresh reminder that Jacksonville International Airport parking spaces can fill up fast as overhead bins on a sold-out flight.

The Jacksonville Aviation Authority expects that when a <u>new \$300 million concourse</u> opens in about three years, the addition of flights frowill add even more pressure on parking at the airport.

Monday, KTNV crews witnessed new "Harry Reid International Airport" signs installed at the rental car return on Warm Springs Road and Gilespie Street. It's the latest development in a lengthy rebranding process for one of the country's busiest airports.

The name change was <u>made official in December of 2021</u>. Airport officials said it would take some time to complete changing the signage and monuments surrounding the airport.

The change came with an estimated \$2 million price tag, which county commissioners said would be covered through private donations, at no cost to taxpayers.
